Accidents: the hidden epidemic

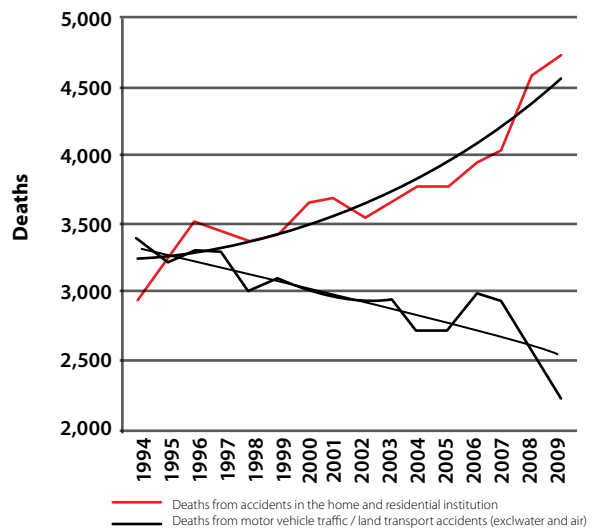
Investing in injury prevention pays. Road fatalities across the UK are at their lowest ever level; in 2010, they fell below 2,000 for the first time. We are immensely proud of RoSPA's huge contribution to this achievement, seen through our many awareness raising initiatives, campaigns for legislative change and practical resources.

Across the UK in 2009, 13,861 people lost their lives as a result of accidents. Our desire to reduce this unacceptable figure, and its associated costs - both human and economic - is why we remain at the forefront of accident prevention. Home safety is a key area for action; the number of home accident deaths stood at more than 5,000 in 2009.

The graph to the right shows the contrasting stories of home accident and traffic accident deaths in England and Wales over 15 years and we believe this reflects the per capita investment in accident prevention. However in some areas of the UK, there is evidence of co-ordinated work reducing home accident deaths. We would like to see far more co-ordinated investment in home accident prevention across the whole of the UK.

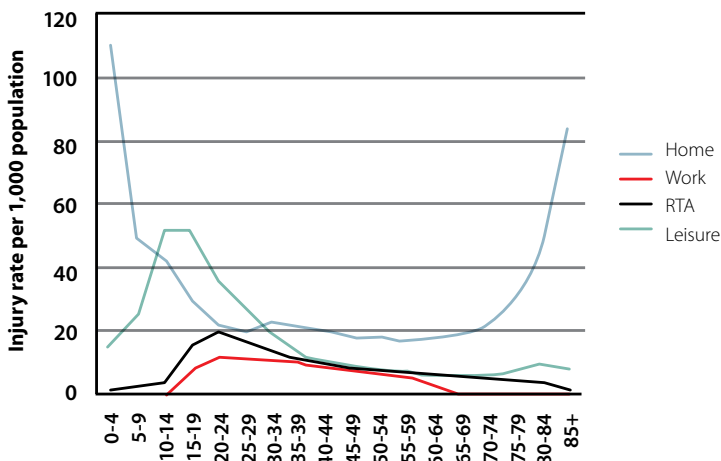
There are also millions of injuries suffered as a result of accidents and we are determined to reduce the burden that these place on families, employers, the NHS and society as a whole.

The graph to the left shows that vulnerable age groups - young children and older people - are particularly at risk in the home while young people are at risk in leisure settings, on the road and in the workplace.

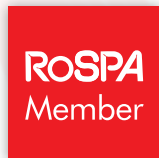

In the UK, accidents at home are responsible for more deaths than accidents on the road or at work. This hidden epidemic results in around 5,000 deaths every year and a further 2.7 million attendances at accident and emergency departments.

Choosing and Using Home Safety Equipment



There are many schemes and organisations already providing home safety equipment to families and older people. For these schemes to be effective in reducing accidental injury, it is essential that the correct type of equipment is provided. Changing the environment is most effective when we change behaviour. People need to understand the purposes and limits of safety equipment.

Who should attend?

All new and established providers of home safety equipment. Ideally, delegates will previously have attended our one-day Child Safety or Older People Safety in the Home courses. As with our other courses, we welcome delegates from the voluntary, community and statutory sectors.

What will they learn?

This course focuses on the effective types and placement of home safety equipment as well as the necessary behavioural changes needed to reduce accidental injury. From stair gates to touch lamps, delegates will gain a greater understanding of which equipment is most effective in the reduction of accidental injury.

Child Safety in the Home



Children under the age of five years are more at risk from an accident at home than anywhere else, many of which are preventable. Developed specifically to address this issue, our course focuses on the most common types of home accidents affecting this age group and looks at how to prevent them.

Who should attend?

All those involved with families and children. From community groups and health professionals to statutory organisations, all have a role to play in the prevention of childhood accidents in the home.

What will they learn?

Falls, burns, scalds, poisoning and fire are the biggest cause of serious and fatal injuries in the home. This course will explore effective measures, both behavioural and environmental, to reduce the risk of injury from these accidents.

Older People Safety in the Home



The risk of accidental injury in the home increases with age. Home accidents can lead to unnecessary pain and suffering and ultimately to greater dependency, yet so many of these accidents are preventable.

Who should attend?

Those involved with the care of older people, from health professionals and housing officers through to home carers and community workers. Statutory organisations, community and voluntary groups can all help to reduce the number and seriousness of home accidents.

What will they learn?

Falls are the main cause of accidents in the home and this one-day course explores falls prevention methods through behavioural and environmental changes. The course also focuses on other common accidents affecting older people, including the reduction of accidental injury through fire, poisoning and scald prevention.

- How the ageing process increases the risk of home accidents

Implementing Home Safety Checks



Research has shown that safety advice given directly to families and older people in their own homes reduces accidental injury. A growing number of organisations now understand that identifying hazards and the risks to families and individuals within their own home can be more effective than the delivery of generic safety information alone.

Who should attend?

New and existing practitioners of home safety checks will find this course invaluable. This course is designed for home safety officers and community and voluntary workers with a home safety remit. Ideally delegates will have previously attended our Child Safety or Older People Safety in the Home one-day course.

RoSPA's road safety engineering courses are based on recognised best practice, and the application of practical and research experience. They are recognised by the majority of employers and by the major professional institutions, and contribute to a delegate's requirements for CET and CPD.



safer roads for everyone

The courses are designed for engineers and technicians working in local authorities, consultancies, overseas organisations, the Department for Transport and executive agencies. They are also suitable for road safety officers, police and armed forces officers and other professionals concerned with road safety.

The two-week course satisfies the Highways Agency training requirement for road safety auditors. Safety audits can only be undertaken on trunk roads and motorways by suitably trained and experienced staff.

Road Safety Engineering

This is a residential course comprising lectures in the first week and practical work in the second.

This course is aimed at those who require a solid, comprehensive understanding of the theory and practice of road accident investigation and prevention.

What will they learn?

- National and local road safety policies, accident causation, accident data
- Accident investigation, site and route solutions, area-wide studies, safety audit
- The theory underpinning accident investigation

- Prevention techniques and the 'hands-on' ability to put these into practice
- Delegates work in teams during the second week to investigate and analyse a real-life case study and design an appropriate remedial programme. Each team produces a written report and a presentation on the final day of the course

Advanced Road Safety Engineering

This course is aimed at experienced road safety professionals who wish to enhance their abilities and ideally have attended the Road Safety Engineering course, or who have worked in road safety engineering for at least two years.

What will they learn?

Each course is designed with the needs of the specific group of delegates in mind and is structured to enable the most current issues and concerns to be explored.
