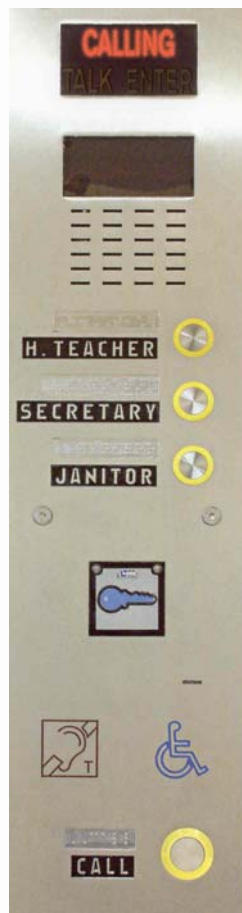

#### Options

- ◆ Inductive loop for use with T-switch hearing aids
- ◆ Flashing beacons at handsets to indicate ringing

Just one example of a door entry system

Check List to control school access:

- ◆ Establish one main entrance and put up signage identifying it as the main entrance
- ◆ Put up signs directing visitors to the main entrance
- ◆ Create a visitor signing in/out and escort procedure
- ◆ Reduce the number of doors which may be opened from the outside
- ◆ Secure custodial entrances and delivery doors during and after school hours
- ◆ Train all school staff, including support personnel, to greet and challenge strangers. Staff should be trained to at least report strangers to the office if they do not feel safe in approaching someone they believe to be an intruder
