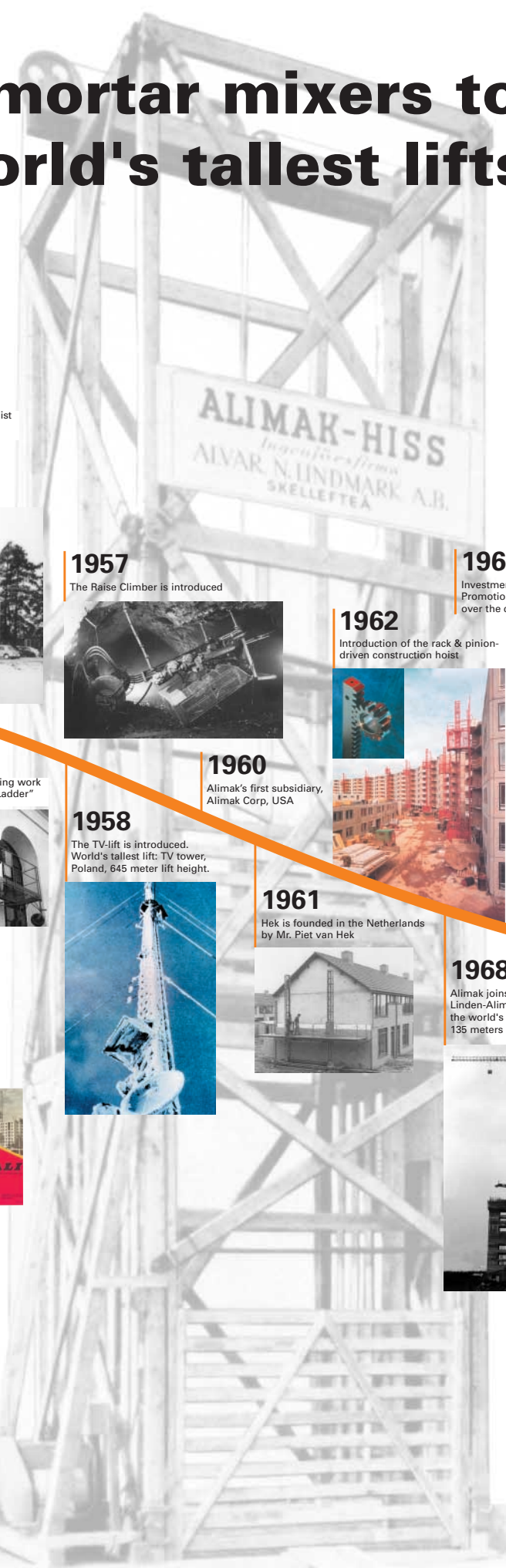




From mortar mixers to the world's tallest lifts

The first passenger hoist in Sweden is approved. Equipped with safety device.



1956

The first mast climbing work platform, "Jakob's Ladder"

The Limak mortar mixer - the company's first patented product



1958

The TV-lift is introduced. World's tallest lift: TV tower, Poland, 645 meter lift height.



1957

The Raise Climber is introduced



1960

Alimak's first subsidiary, Alimak Corp, USA

1961

Hek is founded in the Netherlands by Mr. Piet van Hek



1962

Introduction of the rack & pinion-driven construction hoist



1968

Alimak joins Linden cranes and forms Linden-Alimak. Linden-Alimak supplies the world's largest freestanding cranes, 135 meters high in 1977.

Investment AB Promotion takes over the company

The first permanent industrial lift is installed



1973

The first delivery to the offshore industry



1976

The first rental company is established

Longest lift: Raise Climber, Norway, 1,050 m



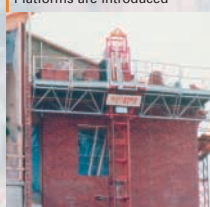

Aliclimber Mast Climbing Work Platforms are introduced



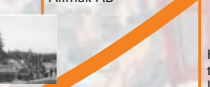
1983

Alimak lift installed in the Statue of Liberty, New York, USA



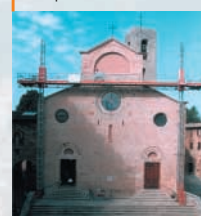

New owners; 3i and Ratos form Intervect AB, the new mother company for Alimak and Hek

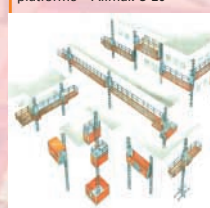
2000

Intervect is renamed Alimak Hek



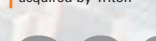
2006
